
Woody Guthrie's music has become as much a part of America as its mountains, its rivers, its forests, and its people. His life has touched all our lives. *Bound for Glory* is his story.

This wonderful tale is warmed by the music of one of our greatest folksingers and by the faces of struggling people during the Great Depression.

In 1936, Woody Guthrie (David Carridine, in the role of a lifetime), along with thousands of other folk, flees the dust bowls of Texas and heads for California in hopes of finding a better life. He hitchhikes, hops freight trains, carries his guitar, and sings his way across America, raising the spirits of the poor with his folksy wisdom and fierce determination, setting their lives to music.

Directed by Hal Ashby and adapted for the screen by writer Robert Getchell, *Bound for Glory* was nominated for six Oscars in 1976 and won for Best Cinematography by Haskell Wexler and Best Original Music Score. Many of Woody's songs have become anthems of commitment and hope and continue to take us from one picket line to another. Sing out for justice!
